## One dead in single-vehicle crash in Lake Worth

One person has died as a result of injuries sustained in a single-vehicle crash this afternoon in Lake Worth, a Florida Highway Patrol supervisor said.

The crash happened just before 4 p.m. on Sixth Avenue South near Interstate 95. The vehicle struck a pole, said Capt. Lee Forshner, spokesman for Palm Beach County Fire Rescue. The crash victim was flown to Delray Medical Center in critical condition, but later succumbed to injuries.

The victim's name has not been released. FHP and the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office are investigating the crash.

The crash caused delays near the crash scene for more than two hours. All lanes are now open, a dispatcher for FHP said.
